People love pinot noir for its elegance and soft fruits but the range of quality and taste can be daunting—as winemaker for Black Kite Cellars Jeff Gaffner likes to say, "Pinot is the great amplifier." Indeed, it is a grape that does a marvelous job of reflecting its environment—for better or worse. When grown in a warmer climate, the wines tend toward more cola-like qualities. When things are chilly and challenging the wines take on different characteristics explains Gaffner, "cool sites naturally restrain the vines, acting as a governor on the vine which creates a more concentrated grape." These are pinot noir wines that lead with depth and minerality, they generally have a savory, mouth-watering edge and are well-suited to aging—but make no mistake they are entirely enjoyable now and worth seeking out. Below are some of my best cool climate sips of 2024—great for gift giving or treating yourself.



Coastlands Vineyard

Cobb Wines Coastlands Pinot Noir, CA, 2021:

Silky and elegant with lovely high-toned fruit and a savory mouthfeel that gets amplified but the raspberry/cherry notes. Planted at one of Sonoma's most western vineyard sites in close proximity to the Pacific Ocean. \$85
